



Replacing Your Countertops

What you should know.

The process of fabricating custom countertops on site is very loud messy. Here are some things you need to know before you have countertops fabricated in your home.

We will be cutting, routing and sanding wood and laminate or solid surface materials in your kitchen. This produces large amounts of dust and small particles of waste material. The glue used to fabricate laminate countertops, as well as the adhesive used to seam solid surface countertops have a very strong odor. The smell clears quickly after the tops are complete, however some people may find it unbearable during fabrication. M.S.D. Sheets available upon request.

Unless you elect to waive the dust control provided by us, we will hang plastic over openings to the kitchen in an earnest attempt to keep the dust from spreading to other parts of the house. The Countersource, inc. installers always clean the work area after they have finished, but your house will not be as clean when we leave, as it was when we arrived.

Things you should do before we arrive.

- Clear everything off your countertops.
- Remove sink and cooking appliances.
- Empty dishwashers
- Remove small furniture (i.e. chairs, barstools)
- Remove drawers from lower cabinets.
- Remove and / or cover everything in lower cabinets.
- Remove and or cover anything in upper cabinets.
- Remove and or cover any thing in your kitchen that you do not want to wash.
- Remove any pets and plants from the kitchen area.
- Be prepared to turn off electricity in the kitchen.

While having new countertops in your home is a wonderful experience, having your old countertops removed and new ones custom fabricated on site isn't. Taking these few steps will make it as pleasant as possible for everyone and shorten the time of fabrication.
